Sharing Ministries / Building Relationships

This was the theme for this year's annual Synod Assembly of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA, held in "our backyard" at the Mohegan Sun Arena, Wilkes-Barre Twp., June 8 – 9.

Over 500 delegates, guests, and visitors attended this event, with representation from most of the 261 ELCA Lutheran congregations in our synod.

Our Synod Bishop, The Rev. Dr. Samuel Zeiser convened this assembly, which had its usual business to conduct like elections to Synod Council, and delegates to the ELCA Church Wide Assembly in Milwaukee in 2019.

As always the worship was inspiring as the assembly was grounded in the proclamation of God's Word and the sharing of bread and wine with spirited singing. A couple highlights of the assembly included hearing the Bishop of the Lutheran Church of Argentina and Uruguay, The Rev. Gustavo Gomez Pascua, speak of how their congregations are witnessing to the gospel through working for justice in their neighbors. Also, the Hmong Community Evangelical Lutheran Church was welcomed into our synod as an official ELCA congregation. The Hmong Community, originally living in SE Asia, were displaced by decades of war. As immigrants they were settled in our country, many of them through the social service agencies of the Lutheran Church in Philadelphia. Now, as a Lutheran worshipping community, they have settled at Allegheny Lutheran Church in Knauers, PA.

A key underlying message throughout this assembly is that in the midst of a rapidly changing culture, the church

can no longer simply open its doors on Sunday morning and expect people to come in. The church needs to be more of a "servant" church – willing to serve its neighbors in our communities. To demonstrate this at our assembly delegates were invited to sign up for pre-arranged service projects that sent them out into our Wilkes-Barre community. Some of the service projects included volunteering at the SPCA, working on maintenance tasks at Bear Creek Camp, serving a meal at Mother Theresa Haven and the Keystone Mission, leading a hymn sign at the Meadows and TimberRidge nursing homes, and even coming Good Shepherd to share in painting a mural with neighborhood children.

In 2019 the Synod Assembly will be held in Hazleton on Saturday, June 1st. With it being held close, maybe even more of Good Shepherd's members can experience the work of the wider church.

CHILDREN LEARN TO BE GOD'S HELPING HANDS

Over 35 children participated in Good Shepherd's Vacation Bible School from June 18-22. "Helping Hands – God's Plan" was the theme based on the parable of The Good Samaritan. Children learned how people lived in Bible times and how they are God's hands by helping others.

Children were introduced to a different Bible verse each day and dressed in tunics and head dresses as in ancient times. They met the traveler who was beaten and robbed on their journey. Then saw how a Samaritan helped to he traveler while others left him lying on the road.

During games children learned to work together as a team to build a tent from a parachute in addition to playing other games to reinforce lessons while getting a chance to run and play.

In crafts children made picture frames, t-shirts, and mini flags with hearts and hands to always remind them that helping others is how God wants us to show love for one another. Children get to make their own design on each craft to show what Helping Hands – God's Plan means to them.
