# A Message from the Treasurer

Lent is a time to search and study our faith. This self-evaluation during Lent leads us to a closer understanding of our God. And part of this understanding, is learning to hear and listen to God. Unfortunately, for many of us, hearing and listening to God is not an easy task. It is so much easier to respond "Don't send me, send <u>(fill in the blank with whomever you think God should send)</u>". Good Shepherd leadership has heard God ask "Whom shall I send" and they have responded "it is I Lord, I have heard you, I will serve and I just need you to show me the way".

Change is tough. Most of us are very uncomfortable when change is required. Good Shepherd has had significant change since last Spring. And the change has made each of us (not just the leadership) more focused on listening and hearing God. The response to requests to share time and talent are allowing us to continue a vibrant ministry. I've been told that sweeping the floor, running the vacuum and so on is not a request from God. I care to differ as this is God's house and he wants his children to have a clean, comfortable space to share the Good News of Jesus.

While are current expenses are much lower than they were when our congregation had a pastor, we still have weekly, monthly and annual expenses. At this point, our income exceeds our expenses; however, not to the point where we can begin to build up savings.

During this Lenten season, slow down and listen to God. If you hear him saying the ministry at the corner of South and South Main is important, consider your response.

Reveal your will as you receive our prayers, and conform our ways to your ways; through Jesus Christ our Lord!


#### **Pre-Confirmation Class**






### **Helping Youth in Crisis**

If you search the Internet for information on how many youth experience some period of homelessness each year you will find estimates that range from 1.3 to over 2 million. Many are homeless due to abuse, neglect, abandonment, or some other crisis taking place in the home. It's difficult to measure the actual numbers. Many of them leave their home with little or nothing to provide for their basic needs. Beginning in May Good Shepherd will begin collecting items needed for an emergency youth shelter that provides temporary housing and crisis intervention for youth.
